

LP12 upgrades

Linn Sondek LP12 turntables have been on the market since the early 70s, and over that time Linn have made numerous improvements so that the current models which look very much the same are much better performers. To their credit they have also made upgrade kits available so that customers could bring their LP12s up to the same standard as the new models. But the upgrades aren't cheap and you can spend several thousand dollars on them. Upgrades have also been made available by other manufacturers, like Origin Live with their DC motor kits and range of tonearms. Interestingly, Linn now offer a DC motor upgrade kit, and have released a succession of tonearms, cartridges and other improvements over the years.

One area of improvement is in the sub-chassis and suspension, and this is where Vinyl Passion (a trading name of the UK company The Missing Link) have focussed their efforts. They now offer a sub-chassis made from aerospace grade alloy, and special suspension springs.

We recently installed one of their kits and can confirm that it raised the level of performance significantly compared to a mid-80s model LP12. The customer had previously bought an IsoKinetik external motor controller and Origin Live Silver tonearm, so he now has an LP12 that rivals one of Linn's new models, but at a much lower price (still substantial however).

The [Vinyl Passion Unity-Two Sub-chassis Combo](#) with blue springs is \$1155, but this is good value when you consider that the Linn Kore aluminium sub-chassis upgrade is \$1895. Owners



of pre-1980s LP12s will also need the Cirkus main bearing upgrade kit at \$1145. These are substantial investments but a new LP12 with those components is about \$6500 so they still represent value for money. However, if you are considering a major upgrade to any turntable I suggest you have a chat with me to see if you may be better to trade it in on a new one.

Pro-Ject MaiA amplifier



Pro-Ject Audio are mainly known for their impressive range of turntables, particularly the entry level and mid-priced ones. But they also build phono preamplifiers and other hi fi components.

The [MaiA is a stereo integrated amplifier](#) with 9 input options. Of course there is a PHONO input, and 3 other analog inputs, but there is coaxial, 2 optical, USB and Bluetooth.

This is what starters in ambitious home audio have been waiting for: a compact integrated amplifier with ultimate input flexibility, that won't compromise on sound quality.

MAIA offers all the digital and analogue input options you could hope for, combined with a dual mono amplifier stage that delivers outstanding audio, and a high-class 24-bit / 192kHz DAC stage. Despite the compact design, up to 9 source devices can be connected simultaneously.

The front-mounted headphone output, Bluetooth connectivity, and included remote control make this a superb and diverse component for home entertainment.

At \$699 this product is excellent value for money with a really intelligent combination of facilities. It can be the centre of a impressive basic hi fi system when teamed up with a [Debut turntable](#) and a pair of quality loudspeakers.

45s at 33
